



Audios + Videos

Providing an "Equivalent Experience" when you have audio/video materials is critical to the audience. A transcription is needed for an audio file. Videos should be closed-captioned. For audio transcription tools, Otter.al is a good option (an individual gets 600-min transcription service for free per month, see pricing). To get started with closed captioning, you may consider YouTube.



TOPP graduates are stepping up to help others new to remote/online teaching.








I can now easily convert my face to face classes to an online format with very little transition for myself or my students.







